# <u>Chairman's Report</u>

# 23.05.2023

- Finally got the BBQ installed. Works a treat. Heats up quick. Only need Scotch Brite water and a little heat to clean. Not sure if the community has used it yet but summer will be the test.
- As noted before we did the stove upgrade and sink upgrade. Jodie has suggested that we have \$2800 to play with if Belinda and Jess have some ideas and pricing for items we might need kitchen related. We don't have to spend it but we've been given the option. We will have a discussion about that in General Business.
- Tim and Belinda and I met with Jodie Archer and Anton Logan from TRC on the 14<sup>th</sup> of March.
- We discussed camping in the Park area as there
  was a bit of confusion as to whether people were
  permitted or not. Anton it may be that all he has to
  do is get the General Manager to agree to it and
  that's all. We have not heard back on that yet
- Discussed wanting to apply to the Crown Lands
  Department for funding to put a toilet and shelter in
  the park area. Something we have been trying to
  get get Council's support for the application for a
  number of years. I pointed out that the toilet system

proposed features an ASS system. Anti Surcharge System. When you know a flood event is coming and likely to inundate the park you operate a lever which seals of the collection tank preventing any sewage leaks. No feed back on that either.

- No feedback on Camping signs until we get feedback on the right to camp.
- Progress Association has lodged enquiries with TRC re rubbish on footpath in Singh Street and possible illegal dwelling on Danglemah Road.
- Council has been and spoken to residents in Singh Street. Not a lot of improvement since
- No feedback on dwelling
- No progress on the old bakery site fire and asbestos cleanup either.
- I've been trying to speak with David Ward from DPI Fisheries about grants for rehabilitating the bank of the river in the park as currently it has a sheer drop off and some undercutting. The plan was to alter the slope of the bank use rocks where necessary to stabilise the bank and establish native trees to stabilise and help hold the bank together. This also provides safer easier access to river frontage for the community and visitors. I will report back with a strategy
- Dave Allerton has secured permission from Doug Scott for us to get some spare Woolbrook Bricks from his pile at the rear of the property. They would be excellent to have for spares for the hall to

- replace any broken or damaged bricks around the hall.
- We would need a place to store them. Perhaps in the old tennis clubhouse. We still need to secure the building covering windows with corrugated iron and modifying the door to a roller type door and an access ramp so that we can store the mower in there. Currently the mower is stored in the rural fire shed. Apparently they, the RFS will be installing security cameras and alarms in the shed which will make it impractical for us to continue to use that location. We need to do some costings.
- We still need to have a working bee to clear up trees near the footbridge over Common Creek and the dead trees on Kevin Smiths boundary fence with the park.
- At the RFS AGM I again raised the matter of the trees on the side of the road into Woolbrook. Trying to get someone to make a determination that it is a fire hazard and to put an order on the cleanup. This has been an ongoing saga for nearly 10 years.
