 - a. Horace Gilchrist: Colin has prepared a booklet outlining the life & service of Horace William Gilchrist who served in the Boer War and was the Police Constable in Nundle from 1902. In late 1914 he volunteered to serve and was enlisted in the Light Horse division of the secondary expeditionary force with the rank of Lieutenant. He died from wounds received in the Dardanelles in June 1915 and buried at sea.
 - ii. Bowling Alley Point Interpretive Sign. Geoff reported on the progress of the BAP sign. A draft version of the text was handed out for discussion. There will be some illustrations eg.the old pedestrian bridge and a list of the sites of some original landmarks, Post Office, Store & mine sites etc. To be sent to Derek Hill for comment.
