



**Australia Day 2021
Terms and Conditions**

BARRABA

Citizen of the Year, Frank Darlington Young Achiever, and Community Event of the Year Award Conditions

- A. All residents of Barraba and district are eligible to be nominated, as are events conducted within Barraba and district.
- B. The Citizen Award may be presented to an eligible resident who has given outstanding service or achievement to the community in the 2020 calendar year. The service shall be voluntary and not conducted in the course of normal employment.
- C. The Frank Darlington Young Achiever Award may be presented to an eligible resident (23 years or under) who has made a contribution to the community or has had an outstanding achievement over a number of years. The service shall be voluntary and not conducted in the course of normal employment.
- D. If you are aware that your nominee has made a significant contribution to the community within other organisations please add this to your nomination form.
- E. An Award may be presented for a community event held in Barraba and district which had significant community impact or involvement of the community during the past 12 months.
- F. Nominees cannot have received a Citizen of the Year, Frank Darlington Young Achiever of the Year Award or Community Event within the past five (5) years.
- G. The Selection Committee and Tamworth Regional Council reserve the right not to present an Award.
- H. Awards will not be granted posthumously.



MANILLA

Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year, Community Event of the Year and Achiever of the Year Award Conditions

- A. All residents of Manilla and district are eligible to be nominated, as are events conducted within Manilla and district.
- B. The Award may be presented to an eligible resident who has made a noteworthy contribution during the past 12 months (2020 calendar year), or has given outstanding service to the community over a number of years. The service shall be voluntary and not conducted in the course of normal employment (i.e. not carried out in working hours).
- C. An Award may be presented for a community event held in Manilla and environs which has significant community impact or involvement of the community.
- D. The Selection Committee and Tamworth Regional Council reserve the right not to present an Award.
- E. Awards will not be granted posthumously.



NUNDLE

A. Citizen of the Year – Over 25 years as at the 26 January 2020

A person who has made a significant contribution to the community over a number of years, or in one year, either as an individual or through a community organisation.

B. Junior Citizen of the Year – Up to 25 years as at 26 January 2020

A person who has achieved a high academic standard, has participated fully in school, has made a significant contribution to the community and/or has attained outstanding achievements in sport.

C. Community Recognition

To acknowledge;

- a) A student or school team having contributed significantly to the school and/or community in one or more ways.

OR

- b) A community member/group/organisation having contributed significantly to the community in one or more ways.

D. Sports

An award for outstanding achievement in sport over a number of years or in the past year.

E. Environmental Citizen of the Year

A person or group shown to have championed an environmental issue.

PLEASE NOTE

1. All nominees must have served in a voluntary capacity.
2. Nominees must live within the boundaries of the former Nundle Shire which is now incorporated in the Tamworth Regional Council.
3. All nominations must be accompanied by a supportive statement (precis) and signed by two people.
4. The Selection Committee and Tamworth Regional Council reserve the right not to present an Award.
5. Awards will not be granted posthumously.

TAMWORTH

Tamworth Citizen of the Year:

Do you know someone who has made a significant contribution to the Tamworth Community in 2020 or for many years? What better way to recognise their achievements and contributions than to nominate them for the 2020 Tamworth Citizen of the Year Award presented on Australia Day 2021. The recipient of the Citizen of the Year Award will also be recognised by receiving the George Nethery Medal, honoring an inspirational Tamworth Community Member.

George Nethery Medal:

George Nethery was an inspirational community member and member of the Tamworth Australia Day Committee. George worked tirelessly for the Community and Tamworth has been a much richer place having had him as a Citizen. George was the recipient of many civic and community service awards including Tamworth's Citizen of the Year in 1998 and was also presented with the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) – unfortunately, George passed away in November 2007.

Tamworth Young Citizen of the Year:

Do you know someone under the age of 25 as at 26 January 2020 who has made a significant contribution to the Tamworth Community in 2020 or for many years? What better way to recognise their achievements and contributions than to nominate them for the 2020 Tamworth Young Citizen of the Year Award presented on Australia Day 2021.

Mitchell Brady Encouragement Award:

The Mitchell Brady Encouragement Award was established by the former Tamworth City Council to commemorate the life of Mitchell Brady, an inspirational young man whose talents as an entertainer, performer, bush poet, broadcaster and public speaker combined with an extraordinary ability to inspire enthusiasm in others of all ages. His generous use of his talents and extensive community work in many fields made him an ideal role model for young people, and finalists for this award have been nominated for their enthusiastic commitment to our community. Mitchell died suddenly on 25 October 1999, at the age of 16. The Mitchell Brady Encouragement Award is open to youth in Year 10 and under in 2020.
