



2021 Stallholder Terms and Conditions

- 1. Applications will be accepted until 30 September 2021. Cancellations must be notified on or before 7 October 2021 in writing or the full fee will be forfeited.
- 2. All stallholders must have current \$20 million Public Liability Insurance and this must be submitted with your application.
- 3. Vendors must only sell the items that have been listed in their application.
- 4. No alcohol, tobacco or cigarettes are permitted to be sold.
- 5. Vendors must behave in a professional and courteous manner.
- 6. Stallholders must take direction from the stall coordinator and other event staff
- 7. Vendors shall not assign, share or sublet all or part of their site without prior written consent from the event organizer Tamworth Regional Council.
- 8. Use of amplification is prohibited.
- 9. All stalls must comply with the Work Health Safety Act 2011 (NSW).
- 10. All tents/marquees/structures must be weighted only. Stallholder to supply own weights.

 No pegs are to go into the ground due to underground infrastructure in the park
- 11. All stallholders are encouraged to minimise waste and use recycled materials as much as possible. General and recycled waste bins will be provided. Please dispose of your rubbish responsibly.
- 12. All oils must be removed from the site at the end of the event do not pour oil/waste water down drains or onto the grass.
- 13. Sites must be left as you found it, please remove all rubbish.
- 14. Food must be prepared as per the NSW Food Act 2003 and NSW Food Regulation 2015. Please visit the NSW Government Food Authority website for further information.
- 15. All food stalls must comply with all regulations as detailed in the NSW Food Authority's <u>Guidelines for Mobile Food Vending Vehicles</u> or <u>Guidelines for Food Businesses at Temporary Events</u> whichever is applicable.
- 16. Food outlets with a deep fryer must have a dry chemical powder fire extinguisher on site.
- 17. Tamworth Regional Council reserves the right to inspect food stall premises at any time.
- 18. No responsibility will be taken for loss or damage to any persons or goods whether or not that loss, damage or injury arises from the negligence of festival staff, volunteers or contractors employed by Tamworth Regional Council.

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- 19. All electrical appliances, leads and power boards must be in safe working order and be recently tagged and tested.
- 20. Tamworth Regional Council makes no guarantee as to the crowd that will be in attendance or the profits you will make at the event. The event will proceed in all-weather unless it is deemed dangerous to the general public.
- 21. The stallholder indemnifies Tamworth Regional Council and its employees and volunteers against any and all liabilities, claims and actions that may eventuate from the establishment, operation and removal of any trading premises (stall) during the 2021 Fiesta La Peel event.
- 22. All stallholders must complete a COVID Safety Plan for your stall that is applicable to food businesses including food stalls Restaurants and cafes (including food courts) | COVID-19
 Safety Plan | NSW Government A copy of your COVID Safety Plan needs to be emailed to Tamworth Regional Council trc@tamworth.nsw.gov.au at the time of your application. You will not be allowed to operate your stall at Fiesta la Peel without a completed COVID Safety Plan.

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
